#### LUCCA Rodolfo Dordoni



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"The desire to deconstruct the volumes is achieved through the contrast of finishes, different thicknesses and directions of the veneers. The glossy modules look as though they are embraced and supported by the robust and solid wood perimeter. The hinged door characterises the front of the unit, while its upper part becomes a stage to show off objects on", explains Rodolfo Dordoni Dordoni.










FIRENZE Rodolfo Dordoni



Firenze is inspired by a new concept of spatial design with its unusual obtuse angle shape that projects the unit into the space. The fixed position of classic storage furniture placed against walls is a thing of the past. "The design strives to underplay the storage volume and to hint at new ways the newly created free space could be used. The overall lightness is accentuated by the glass sides displaying its contents". Its cover is handmade from oak veneers that are joined at the corner and a light on the inside is turned on when doors are opened, and it even has a motion sensor.







RIO Sebastian Herkner




The Rio collection is based on my fundamental design language working with honest materials and local craftsmen to achieve unique designs.

Rio is about the balance of materials and the balance of proportions.

The Rio cabinets have in common that they are all placed on solid marble cylinders. They provide stability and grandeur in contrast to the precise and fine crafted cabinets on top. Thin wooden frames and push to open doors with different inlays like structured wood are kind of bridge the two pedestals. The dialogue between all components creates a sophisticated character.







#### CHICAGO

#### Norm architects





Inspired by the modernist architecture and the unobstructed repetitive building techniques known from the mid century, the Chicago cabinet collection stands as a tribute to this particular architectural period.

With its light and floating appearance the sideboard almost appears as a piece of modern architecture itself. The elevated solid steel construction gives stability and structure while the floating wooden cabinet adds the spacial impression. The table top functioning as a floating roof with its extended eaves completes the minimalistic framework combining three simple natural materials, wood, steel and stone.

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"Stockholm is a city that has left a mark on me as a designer. Its influence on my Stokholm Project is the reason for the name of my product for Punt, but also especially for the essence of honesty on material and language that provides Punt with a certain Scandinavian soul."

A new kind of sophistication in the quality and combination of materials, and in the precise styling and balanced radius.



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


MALMÖ Mario Ruiz

# SUSSEX Terence Woodgate



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"Designers can find inspiration everywhere and at any time. Sussex came about while driving my children to school. We live in Sussex and weatherboard barns are everywhere. The tall fishing huts in Hastings, tall so that the nets can be hung inside, are the most famous. I was working on a design and I saw that by using a graceful architectural weatherboard- like front, I could create a cabinet with a uniform facade irrespective of the composition of drawers & doors."

## TACTILE Terence Woodgate



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"Design is a fusion of art and technology. Here it was the technology, the touch catch and touch drawer runners, which drove the design. I realised that by incorporating these I could set back the doors and the drawers within the frame. As I played with the concept I saw that I could set them back the thickness of the leg, allowing the leg to elegantly wrap around and embrace the cabinet. As it was a cabinet that invited you to touch, Tactile had to be the name."



SLAT

"Planes and volumes, composed as needed. A geometrical game, a game of colours, surfaces and textures. Slats is a series of building blocks that can be constructed like Lego to the required specification so as to create an interior architecture of positive and negative volumes - blocks and gaps. Proportion, detail, colour and material combination are the guiding elements."


An architectural, linear, and minimal project, not without elements of warmth. Wood is the protagonist in its essence and in the detail of the doors characterized by a vertical pattern that denotes three-dimensionality to an essential object.

Once again Ludovica+Roberto Palomba designs a minimalist masterpiece that does not renounce to excite for Punt Mobles, a Spanish company that has always been characterized by the care and refinement of the details of their projects.

A winning, versatile project that furnishes and solves functionality in urban spaces, but which, thanks to wood and its declination, brings warmth and texture to the space.



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The desk and bench are inspired by the same concept as the sideboard, although with different uses in mind. The first consists of a low storage space made of solid oak strips, hand glued on the doors and sides, and an extendable top (it can be used in different positions, in other words the top can be moved) with two legs made with a chamfered detail. The vertical pattern of the strips brings out the grain of the wood and strikes the perfect balance with the table itself. The plinth of the sideboard leads into the bench, each part with their own leg, and comes with or without a cushion.







#### STOCKHOLM BOOKCASE


The Stockholm collection emerged as an exercise in highlighting the profound culture of materials and the constructional quality of Punt's wooden furniture. Its creation represented a turning point in the history of the brand because of how its design proposed a new approach in the way of treating Punt's most iconic materials in combination with other unusual materials in the brand, such as aluminium, exploring a new dialogue hitherto unexplored by the firm and establishing new codes of union and use.

The first project in the collection was the Stockholm sideboard, with its elegant identity, based on the very careful use of wood and its characteristic aluminium finish in different colours. This combination of different textures and materials on a formal base of calm aesthetics is what has generated a story from which a multitude of different references of sideboards, tables, bookcases and lamps have grown over time.



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








### LITERATURA Vicent Martínez



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"La Literatura" bookcase, designed in 1985 and winner of several prizes and awards, such as the 1986 ADI FAD selection, displayed in museums and an undeniable contribution for Punt Mobles to obtain the National Award of Design in 1997. Classified as a contemporary classic since 1997. Its distinctive bookcases on casters have been used for decades for storing thousands of books, hosting the digital era and integrating into all kinds of architecture and interior design works.







## $\frac{\text{CORAL}}{\text{Arik Levy}}$



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"I designed and dreamt Coral up as an idea that could be transformed and turned into a wide range of products that would put something on the market that would respond to current changes and activities" Levy adds. "Coral's leaves or petals that sensually rotate around a displaced centre interact with the space and read light and shadow at every moment. Its stability, down to its meticulous geometry and construction, provides ample legroom for the user as well as offering visual and ergonomic comfort. Almost like in abstract art, Coral lets you be any metaphor you can think of".

### STOCKHOLM TABLE Mario Ruiz

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"One-leg table with steel base and oak or walnut wood top, honestly showing its structural core.

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### SENA Christophe Pillet



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With two versions of a chair and a stool having been launched in 2022, French designer Christophe Pillet is rounding off his Sena collection with an armchair and a sofa that keep the curved back and sleek, modern lines of the seats of its predecessor.

The sofa is made up of different modules to create different shapes with a viewto adapting to any environment (homes, hotels, offices...). It is springy and soft, organic and fluid. The armchair, in turn, is a natural evolution of the first version of the chair.

Both proudly flaunt their visible seams, which again hark back to the brand's own craftwork yet, at the same time, they are straightforward, unpretentious and extre- mely versatile. Two pieces made to stand the test of time.

"A line of metal elegantly embraces the chair, from the armrests and around the wooden backrest. The oak seat and backrest contrast with the slim metal tube that characterises the design's shape". This is how the designer Sebastian Herkner describes his new Pecan chair for Punt.

It is an ultra-versatile piece that can be adapted to any interior design project, from living rooms to kitchens, restaurants or offices. The light and thin steel structure contrasts with the wood, acting as a frame.

Apart from its aesthetics, its ergonomics have also been worked on, making it comfortable while also being stackable.

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"Mava Chair is inspired by the image of original wooden clothes-pegs from the beginning of the 20th century. These archetypal pegs were slotted in the middle to hold clothes and washing-line together.

In a similar way the legs of Mava are slotted to hold the backrest firmly from both sides. The backrest with its wide, open form seems fly in the wind like a piece of cloth, but firmly attached with the legs."
